Newman Elected as Chairman of the Board of Trustees

If you had asked Roderick (Rod) Newman 30 years ago what he would be doing today, he wouldn't have said still working for the City of Houston or serving as Chairman of the Board of HMEPS. But he's glad things worked out like they did.

When Newman began working for the City's Human Resources Department, he thought it would be a shortterm job on the way to the corporate world. "But then I woke up one day and I had been in Human Resources for 5 years, 10 years, 15 years, 20 years, 25 years and now 30 years," says Newman, who is Division Manager over the Selection Services and Employee Relations Division. "I just realized along the way that I like helping people that's what HR is about. It's a people profession and I love interacting with people."

Rod was elected as the first African-American to serve on the HMEPS Board in 1992, and was elected Secretary

Mose Honored to Serve as Secretary

At the February Board meeting the Board of Trustees elected Sherry Mose as Secretary. Mose was elected to the position vacated by Roderick J. Newman, who was elected Chairman.

"I would like to thank the Board for giving me this opportunity and will continue to work to keep HMEPS a strong system," said Mose.

Mose has served on the HMEPS Board as a Trustee since 1998 and also is the Plan Administrator for the City of Houston Deferred Compensation Plan.

It has been a busy Spring for Mose, who was also recently elected to the board of the Texas Association of Public Employee Retirement Systems (TEXPERS). "I am looking forward to serving our hard-working participants and retirees on both the local and state levels," said Mose.

A Career Dedicated to Public Service

After 35 years as a trustee on the HMEPS Board, Fred Holmes has decided to close out his long tenure of dedicated service, leaving a lasting legacy of which we can all be proud. In January, Fred resigned from the Board to pursue other activities and to move to Baltimore, Maryland to be closer to his family.

Fred Holmes entered into public service in 1964 – years before many City of Houston employees had even started high school. In the 43 years that followed, Holmes dedicated his career to the public, the employees who serve them and, of course, the development and growth of HMEPS. "The Fund will not be the same without him – he will be missed for his dedication and commitment to the members of HMEPS," said Barbara Chelette, HMEPS Board Member.

Holmes began his public service with the City of Houston, working as an employee in the Civil Service-Human Resources Department from 1964-1991. Lonnie Vara, who recently returned to the HMEPS Board, worked with Holmes in the 1970s. "Fred knew all the politicians and the aides, and how the City worked. And here I was this new employee who had only been there a month, and Fred would take me around and introduce me as his 'colleague.' He really had the ability to make you feel good."

He was elected in 1972 to serve as an employee Trustee on the HMEPS Board of Trustees. Upon his retirement as a City employee in 1991, Holmes continued his service on the Board as a Trustee representing the retirees. During his 35 years of service with the Board, he has been elected to and has served as

Holmes has fond memories of the people he worked with while on the HMEPS' Board. "It was a genuine pleasure to serve on the Board all of these years, and I have enjoyed working with HMEPS' outstanding staff of profession-

als," said Holmes. "My service with HMEPS has been an exceptional opportunity to both learn and to contribute, and I will miss my associations here. I wish the trustees and staff continued success going forward."

David L. Long, Executive Director, said, "During his service to HMEPS, Fred helped increase its total membership from 8,729 to its current 23,000 members and grow the fund's total assets from \$36 million to more than \$2.3 billion. Fred put his heart and soul into the fund and for that we should all give him thanks. Without him the Fund would not be where it is today." Fred also most recently served as Treasurer of the Texas

Association of Public Employee Retirement Systems (TEX-PERS). "Pension funds across Texas owe Fred a debt of grati-

tude for his service. He was involved in TEXPERS from day one and helped many funds get established and become more professional and businesslike," said George Cones, a former President and founding member of TEXPERS.

Chelette, who worked with Holmes on both the TEXPERS and HMEPS Boards, said, "Serving with Fred was a very rewarding professional and personal experience. Even in the most difficult of times Fred would always be the first to step up to take on the workload and make the tough decisions, always while sharing his wonderful sense of humor."

Holmes earned his B.B.A. from the University of Texas and is a Chartered Trustee, Baylor University, Institute for Pension Funds. He is also a member of the National Society of Pension Professionals.

Vara Returns to the HMEPS Board

Lonnie Vara was recently appointed by Ray Kennedy to the Retiree Trustee position vacated by Fred Holmes. Lonnie views his return to the HMEPS Board as a rare opportunity to continue serving the active and retired members of HMEPS.

"I have always felt a strong responsibility toward the pension system," he says. "My past positions, as Board member and the City's Human Resources Director, help me to better understand the challenges and opportunities facing our pension system."

Vara began working in the City's Civil Services Department in 1974 and retired as the Human Resources Director in 2006 after 32 years. He had previously been on the HMEPS Board as the Mayor's Representative

Member Questions to Benefits Counselors

Dear HMEPS Benefits Counselor,

"I am currently employed by the City, an active member of HMEPS (in Group B) and have about 11 years of service. I was talking with a new employee who is in Group D and was wondering if my benefits were affected in any way by this new group?"

Answer: "Employees hired for the first time on or after January 1, 2008 are in Group D. Because you were hired before January 1, 2008, your benefits are not affected by the Group D provisions. This would be true even if you had terminated your employment and returned to service after January 1, 2008; you remain in the same group you belonged to on your last day of previous service with the City.

when he was the Director of Human Resources. He feels his years of Human Resources background and his prior service on the HMEPS Board helps him hit the ground running.

"I am not a novice. I am aware of the Board and its responsibili-

ties, and I know the staff," Vara says. "I have a tremendous respect for City employees, the public service they perform and the fact they need to be compensated. And a big part of that compensation is their pension. I want to work to continue to keep the benefits City employees have earned safe and secure. Pension is a very important part of the city's compensation package needed to continue to attract and retain employees with the skills and knowledge needed to efficiently run the fourth largest city in the nation."

Vara's goals include working to narrow the funding gap, ensuring investments yield good returns, and educating members about their retirement benefits. Working for the City for more than three decades seemed inevitable for Vara, who feels a sense of responsibility to the community. Inspired by his parents' similar commitment, he worked for seven different mayors: full time for Fred Hofheinz,

Jim McConn, Kathy Whitmire, Bob Lanier, Lee Brown and Bill White – and going back to when he was a lifeguard at a city pool when Louie Welch was mayor.

He still keeps in touch with City employees he used to work with, even occasionally dropping by the office with a load of tamales to visit prior co-workers.

And now that he's back on the Board, he is spending time focused on HMEPS. "It is our city employees, past and present, whose dedication to public service has made this a great

city. As a pension trustee I feel a very strong obligation to all retirees, current and future, to protect this most valuable asset they have earned," Vara says.

three years ago. In January, fellow trustees elected him to serve as Chairman, replacing Fred Holmes.

Again, though, it was sort of a fluke when he first ran for the Board. Thirty years ago, the City had a contributory pension plan with a vesting period of 15 years. Through the years, he watched the pension programs change, but never thought there was much improvement. In the meantime, by 1990, he was married with a wife and children – and he suddenly started paying attention to his future retirement opportunities.

"I was concerned about my future and what I would have, and I realized the retirement plan was not good," he said. "I wanted to effect changes for the future, the HMEPS Board had been revamped and my friends talked me into running."

As a Trustee for more than 15 years, Newman said, he has learned a lot about the pension industry, retirement systems, retirement plans, investment policies, and stocks and bonds. "For a layman like me, the education is ongoing and never stops," he said. "I always am paying attention, listening and learning."

Newman said he is grateful for leaders like Holmes and Appointed Trustee Barbara Chelette – who guided him and taught him how to work with a group to get things done. "From them, I learned to listen to the members. Serving on the Board has been a wonderful, powerful experience for me, and I realize what an important role I play in so many people's future."

As Chairman, Newman said he wants to ensure the Board of Trustees continues to work for a successful retirement system providing good benefits and a strong investment portfolio. He also wants to ensure the Board "continues to utilize its greatest asset, its members, when making decisions."

As an elected Trustee, Newman says his door is always open. "I want members to bring concerns to me, share their issues with me and always talk to me. I am always open to the membership."

Outside of his HR job and outside of HMEPS, Newman likes to travel, fish and swim. He and his wife also enjoy cooking, entertaining and spending time with their two grown children.

As Chairman, he plans to stay alert for opportunities that benefit everyone. He also hopes that even though the Trustees may disagree at times, that they can do so in a respectful way that keeps HMEPS moving forward successfully.

"I want to keep the stability and make sure this system stays strong so that the members never have to worry about losing the benefits they have earned." he said.
