## **HMEPS Educational Outreach Program Offers Participants Opportunities to Learn More About Their Pension Benefits**

The 25,000 participants of HMEPS, whether just starting their careers with the City or receiving a pension benefit, all face a myriad of questions about their pension benefits and retirement plans. For many, it can be an intimidating process, especially when factoring in families and other life occurrences.

HMEPS is here to help, and we've expanded our educational services. HMEPS has launched its Educational Outreach Program, which uses a team approach to provide participants with the information they need today to make decisions about their HMEPS benefits and other financial issues as well, such as paying for a child's college or planning for retirement.

We have been holding "field meetings" at different City departments where a HMEPS benefits counselor and our new staff Financial Counselor meet with a group of employees to outline HMEPS benefits as well as discuss other financial issues and answer questions. These on-site classes are flexible, free and

designed to accommodate our hard-working participants' schedules. This is in addition to individual counseling we continue to offer at HMEPS' downtown office. (Continued on Page 4)

better than last year's successful expo, which attracted more than 850 people! We'll have detailed information about the expo later this year.

In this edition, we also have a report on HMEPS' investments and their market value. Obviously, some of HMEPS' investments reflect the turmoil of the times, but it's important to remember that the economic roller-coaster does not affect our ability to pay benefits. We have a well-diversified investment portfolio and a highly disciplined investment approach that has brought us great success and will get us through this recession.

The economy also is a priority for the 81st Texas Legislature, which is in session until June 1. The deadline for filing bills was March 13 and House and Senate committees are busy deciding

which of the many measures filed will make it to a final vote. HMEPS staff members are closely monitoring lawmakers' actions and we are prepared to respond quickly and appropriately to any proposal that could affect the pension system. 
for our participants' best interests. HMEPS is a better organization because of his leadership and his unwavering spirit ensures his place in HMEPS history.

#### **HMEPS Election Results**

#### **Important Tax Information for Retirees**

The Making Work Pay credit provision was signed into law on February 17, 2009, as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. This provision requires HMEPS to withhold less income tax from your pension benefit, even if you are not eligible for the Making Work Pay credit. This means you ultimately may have to pay more income tax because of the required reduced withholding. The only way for you to avoid the reduced withholding is to submit a new Form W-4P to HMEPS specifying the amount you want withheld or claiming fewer exemption allowances.

You are not required to make a change to your current withholdings, but if you do not want to have your withholding reduced, you need to file a new withholding form (Form W-4P) with HMEPS.

To change the amount of federal income tax withheld from your retirement benefit, complete and submit HMEPS Form W-4P located on our website (www.hmeps.org/forms, and scroll down to form "W-4P"), and specify the amount you want withheld, or request fewer exemption allowances (if applicable).

If you have questions regarding these changes, please contact the IRS or a qualified tax advisor. HMEPS is not able to advise retirees on tax issues.

Are you in the process of, or already moved to, a new address (or one different from the current address HMEPS has on record)? If so, and you are an active City employee, you need to contact your payroll representative to ensure the City has your correct address on file. The payroll system for the City stores two addresses, but HMEPS can only capture the first address you have listed. If you are a retiree, you need to submit a "Change of Address" form to the HMEPS office (available from the HMEPS office or on the website at www.hmeps.org).

Maintaining a current address is necessary to ensure you receive important communications from HMEPS, including election notices, annual statements, Reports to Participants and more. If you need assistance, please call the HMEPS office at 713-595-0100.

"HMEPS has always offered its participants the opportunity to learn about their pensions. But with a very large, diverse workforce like we have with the City we wanted to introduce some more flexible options," says David L. Long, HMEPS' Executive Director. "This includes holding meetings at department locations in the early morning or late at night so that employees on different shifts are able to attend the meetings. Or perhaps a participant wants to have a more personal meeting at the HMEPS office with family members in attendance. We now have multiple options that can accommodate everyone's schedule."

There are additional ways to learn about HMEPS benefits, including using our website and attending a financial expo later this year. We've outlined our educational services below, but you can always call the office at 713-595-0100 and a HMEPS representative will get you headed in the right direction.

## 5 Ways You Can Learn More About Your Pension Benefits

## Meet with an HMEPS Benefits Counselor

You may call and schedule a one-on-one meeting with your HMEPS benefits counselor at the HMEPS office. During the meeting, the counselor will explain your pension benefits and answer questions you may have. You may make an appointment to meet with counselors Monday-Friday during regular office hours.





## $\mathbf{2}$ Meet with the HMEPS Financial Counselor

You may call and schedule a one-on-one meeting with the HMEPS Financial Counselor, Steve Waas, at the HMEPS office. During the meeting, Steve will assist you with question you may have about financial matters.

## **3.** Attend a Field Meeting

HMEPS benefits counselor(s) will visit your specific City location and give a 1 to 2-hour (approximate) presentation and answer questions. Field meetings are typically reserved for 5 or more employees. If you would like to attend a meeting at your location, please have your supervisor call the HMEPS office to schedule a meeting.



## **4** Visit the HMEPS website at www.hmeps.org

The HMEPS website is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week from any computer with internet access. You can read and download HMEPS Forms, print publications, news updates, articles and more. If you do not have a computer, numerous City libraries have computers with internet access.

## **5.** Attend the 4th Annual Financial Fitness Expo

## **Open for Business: HMEPS Now Offering Financial Counseling**

#### Q.You have many years experience in financial counseling. How is your role at HMEPS different?

HMEPS is offering a new service, indi-

Steve Waas, who has over 25 years expe-

rience in financial planning, banking and

risk management, is available to help

participants address a wide variety of

financial issues. We asked Steve a few

questions about his role at HMEPS.

A. "The great thing about this job is that I can do it with complete objectivity. I'm not paid by any bank, brokerage firm, or insurance company. So I have no pressure to push any particular product or service. I can focus entirely on giving participants unbiased information to help them make the best informed decision possible."

## Q. How can you help participants manage a DROP account after retirement?

A. "Retiring participants have several options to choose from with respect to their DROP accounts, and it can get confusing. I can help them sort out these options and give careful consideration to the pros and cons of different decisions. This can be one of the biggest decisions a participant will make regarding their retirement."

#### Q. When a participant becomes eligible for DROP, how should he or she decide whether or not to participate?

A. "DROP is an important financial tool for many participants, but various issues should be considered before committing to it. Do you expect your salary to change much over the next few years? How many years of service do you currently have? Answers to these and other questions can make a big difference regarding how meaningful the DROP program would be for you."

## *Q.* What other financial topics do you frequently encounter with retirees?

A. "Retirees usually face important decisions about their Social Security benefits, which should be considered in combination with the other important financial decisions they are making at that time. Sometimes retirees make these decisions without really considering all of the consequences - consequences that may last for the rest of their lives."

# Q. Can you help participants decide whether to invest in an annuity? Annuities are aggressively advertised and sold by the insurance industry.

A. "There are many, many different kinds of annuities. Some are fairly straightforward and can be very useful for some people. Others are enormously complex and expensive, and it's hard to see how anyone but the salesman could benefit. I can't recommend that you invest or not invest in any particular product. But I might be able to help you zero in on the key issues and questions you need to address."

#### Q. What about other financial products?

A. "I have experience with other topics as well, such as how IRAs and reverse mortgages work."

## Q. Are retirees the only ones who can benefit from your expertise?

A. "You don't have to be in the near-retirement phase to benefit from this service. I have worked with city employees on issues such as saving for their kids' college education."

## *Q.* With the ongoing economic crisis, is now the time to be making difficult financial decisions?

A. "The financial turmoil like we've had recently makes some people reluctant to even ask for help. Sometimes there is so much bad news out there that people just want to shut it all out. But it's important to not crawl into a shell. Make sure you have access to as much information as possible when making important financial decisions."

#### Q. Ok, so how does a participant get access to your services?

A. "If you're planning to meet with your Benefits Counselor, it is sometimes a good idea to schedule a financial counseling session to immediately follow. But you can call the pension office any time to set up an appointment. It's usually a good idea to speak with me first just to get an idea of what information you might want to bring to the meeting."

### Consumer Alert Issued Regarding Credit Counseling Services

Recently the Texas Attorney General's office issued a Consumer Alert regarding credit counseling services and related enterprises. "Credit Counselors" provide education. "Debt Management" firms allow someone to consolidate their debt into a single monthly payment, perhaps at a lower interest rate. "Debt Settlement" or "Debt Negotiation" is a risky procedure involving halting payments to creditors and attempting to renegotiate not just interest rates but the principal owed as well. There are legitimate businesses in this area, but the field is rife with scams and incompetents as well.

Before committing to a service, check to see if there have been complaints against the firm filed at the Office of the Attorney

General (www.texasattorneygeneral.gov) or the Better Business Bureau (www.bbb.org). Check if they are members of national accreditation organizations such as the National Federation for Credit Counseling (www.nfcc.org) or the Association of Independent Consumer Credit Counseling Agencies (www.aiccca.org).

Don't suspend your skepticism just because an organization claims to be "nonprofit." In 2006 the IRS investigated numerous "nonprofit" credit counseling agencies and found that most were erroneously claiming this status.
