LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN

SHARING A PERSONAL VIEW

"I urge you to vote in the

upcoming [May 15th] election

to express your views on this

important matter."

Dear Plan Participants,

I would like to take this opportunity to address some of the questions and concerns that you, our participants, have expressed regarding the news you have heard and read about in recent weeks about HMEPS and the upcoming opt-out election. First, I would like to reassure you that the Board and staff of HMEPS are committed to working with all interested parties to identify any problem

areas that might exist and to develop solutions that are effective, meaningful and in the best interests of participants.

HMEPS has been there for its participants for 60 years, and we are going to be there for another 60 and beyond. Investment returns and funded levels have gone through cycles over the years, with some very good years and some not so good years. However, a pension fund such as HMEPS has a long-term horizon--the Board knows this and strategically plans for the long term. Your Board members have over 130 years of combined hands-on experience to steer the board and provide benefits for City employees.

Over the past decade, your elected trustees have worked diligently with City officials to help implement changes in state law that provide participants and their families with stable and secure retirements. We will continue to do everything we can to ensure that you have a good pension that you and your loved ones can rely on, and a board that will deliver those benefits and pension services in a professional manner.

The City has called for an election on May 15, 2004 to attempt to exclude the City and the pension systems from the

recently passed state constitutional amendment that prohibits reducing or impairing accrued benefits. We have provided additional information on the election on pages 2-5 of this newsletter. I urge you to vote in the upcoming election to express your views on this important matter.

Regardless of the outcome of the election, it is the desire of the HMEPS Board to continue working with the City Administration to help find fair and meaningful solutions to the funding shortfall, without our partici-

pants losing their accrued benefits. We know that changes will have to be made to the pension plan, and we will certainly meet and discuss constructive, meaningful requests from the City to review the problem. We have hired a new independent actuary for the Board. We intend to review any and all options on the table, and we will share our informational projects in this area with the City.

City employees and retirees want to make sure that their pension plan moves on into this century in a solid manner. It is what we trustees work long and hard to achieve. In the 1970's, the municipal fund totaled \$250,000,000; as of today there is over \$1.4 billion in the fund. Houston pension boards have stood side-by-side with City representatives in the last several legislative sessions to help implement important benefit improvements for City employees and retirees. We ask only that the City Administration, City Council, employees, unions, retirees and HMEPS Board work together with the same cooperation and teamwork in the future. I

know it can be done, because I have been there in Austin and Houston and witnessed it.

What Is An Opt-Out Election?

On September 13, 2003, Texas voters approved an amendment to the Texas Constitution that added Article XVI, Section 66 (the "Constitutional Amendment"). The Constitutional Amendment prohibits reducing or impairing the "accrued" retirement or death benefits of vested members and retirees provided by the public retirement systems of

political subdivisions, including HMEPS.

Opt-Out Election. The Constitutional Amendment provides a one-time opportunity for political subdivisions to hold an election to exclude themselves, or to "opt out," of the Constitutional Amendment. The City has called such an election on May 15, 2004 to allow voters to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" opting out (see page 3, opposite, for the ballot language of Proposition No. 1 and pages 4-5 for early voting times and locations). If a majority of the people who are voting decide to vote "FOR" the proposition, the prohibitions against reducing or impairing accrued benefits of vested

employees and retirees will no longer apply to participants of HMEPS and the other Houston pension systems, Houston Police Officers' Pension System (HPOPS) and Houston Firefighters' Relief & Retirement Fund (HFRRF). If a majority of the people who are voting decide to vote "AGAINST" the proposition, the accrued benefits of vested employees and retirees in HMEPS, HPOPS and HFRRF cannot be reduced or impaired. However, no matter whether the opt-out passes or fails, State law requires that any changes to the pension systems would have to be approved by the board of trustees of the respective systems or the State Legislature.


Several participants have asked whether there are any other cities in Texas having an opt-out election. At this time, we know that Galveston and Texas City are holding opt-out elections. Dallas has decided not to have one. I urge you to read the information on pages 3-5 so that you understand the language of Proposition No. 1 that is on the ballot, and know when and where voting will take place.

Opt-Out Election (Proposition I) Sample Ballot

On May 15, 2004, voters will be asked to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the following proposition:

Proposition No. I

Shall the City of Houston, Texas, and the retirement systems it finances, exercise the constitutional right to be exempt from the application of the provisions of Article XVI, Section 66 of the Texas Constitution, adopted in 2003, entitled Protected Benefits Under Certain Public Retirement Systems?



Voting Information For Opt-Out Election (Proposition I)

The following information was obtained from various voting resources and is intended to be a general overview of voting procedures on May 15 and the early voting period from April 28 to May 11.

What are the dates and times for voting?

Early Voting

- · First day of early voting is April 28 at any early voting location (see next page for locations and times).
- Last day of early voting is May II.

Election Day

May 15, 2004, 7:00 A.M. - 7:00 P.M.

Where can I get more information?

Paul Bettencourt's office (Tax-Assessor-Collector, Harris County) is in charge of voter registration and related information. Representatives from his office have informed HMEPS that individuals looking for more information related to voting should contact the Harris County Clerk's office. The Honorable Beverly B.
